#### **Minutes Annual Meeting**

# Glyndon Lutheran Church, Minutes of Annual Meeting, January 25th 2015

- 1. President Jeff Wallin announced a quorum and called the meeting to order.
- 2. Devotions were led by Interim Pastor Steve Wold.
- **3. Secretary's Report:** Motion was made by Leroy Babolian to accept the report. Seconded by Monte Olson. Motion carried.
- **4. Treasure's Report:** Roger Wyland made a motion to accept the report. Seconded by Lois Wyland. Motion carried.
- **5. Reports:** A motion was made by Roger Wyland to accept the secondary reports. Seconded by Lois Wyland. Motion carried.

# 6. 2015 Budget Determination:

- Discussion on GLC sponsoring Pastor Jeni and Pastor Colin on their Jerusalem Mission. This was tabled for Council to discuss at a later date.
- Motion was made by Leroy Babolian to add \$10,000 to line 7400 of the budget to repair the boiler. Monte Olson seconded. Motion carried.

#### 7. New Business

- **a. Organ:** Organist Jean Hellner presented information on the history of our organ and the costs to repair it. She received a proposal for a maintenance and repair of \$4,800. It was discussed to have Jean put together a letter with the history and proposed work to be done on the organ and request for donations from congregation to fund this project. A motion was made by Esther Ellingson to follow this plan was made. Seconded by Don Lein. Motion Carried.
- **b. Serving committees:** Discussion on bringing back the serving committees. Council will address this at the next council meeting with the women of the circles as they would create the new committees.
- **c. Church Directory:** It has been 8 years since our last directory was made. Leann Wallin presented information from a local company that would come to Glyndon Lutheran Church to take the pictures for the directory. Leann volunteered to head this project. Lois Wyland made a motion to accept doing the directories. Monte Olson seconded. Motion carried.
- **d. Call Committee:** Call committee is in the process of forming to search for a new minister. It requires at least 6 volunteer voting members of GLC to be appointed by the council. Please call the office if you are interested in being a part of the call committee.
- **e. Synod Assembly:** Need two members to attend the assembly in May. It is a two day event. If you are interested please call the office.

#### **Pastor's Report**

New Year's Blessings to you! It's hard to believe that 2016 is already here as I begin to reflect back on 2015. I know that for me, and I am guessing for many of you, the word of the year was "transition." It seemed there were many transitions taking place in the life of the church as welcomes and goodbyes were shared both here at GLC and in my own life; as Eric and I prepared to leave the life we knew in Bozeman to come and take the call here in Glyndon. However, one thing I have noticed in all of the transitions is the opportunity for renewal and visioning along with a chance to dream and to explore what already is along with what could be here at Glyndon Lutheran.

Early in 2015, Pastor Steve Wold, helped to create a vision for the organ along with Dr. Jean Hellner, our organist. The two of them, along with the help of many others, both within and outside of the congregation, were able to raise the necessary funds to restore our historic organ. Upon my arrival in July I had the opportunity to hear the "good as new instrument" at work as we worshiped together for the first time on July 22<sup>nd</sup>. Then in October, we had another opportunity to celebrate the work and the history of this beautiful instrument at the Organ Rededication Concert that took place on a beautiful fall afternoon with nearly 80 people in attendance.

As I begin to reflect back on my first six months here at GLC, it is amazing to think of how much has already happened beginning with an installation service where we welcomed Bishop Larry Wohlrabe to preach and preside over the installation, while also welcoming a new sister in Christ through the sacrament of Holy Baptism. Then there are the many program activities that started in the fall, introducing me to nearly 100 new people that I had not met over the summer months. In October we celebrated Reformation Sunday, with the Rite of Confirmation or Affirmation of Baptism for 13 of our youth who were ready to take the important step saying "Yes, I believe!" To top it all off, we gathered together with nearly 250 people on Christmas Eve to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Looking back, it has simply been amazing, but I know that there are many to thank for helping to make this year such an amazing one.

A special thanks goes out to all who served on the call committee; Jeff Wallin, Kyle Roelofs, Paula Nelson, Samantha Blattenbauer, Linda Pavola, and Cindy Henriksen. Together they put in many hours preparing the paperwork to begin the official call process, meeting with the synod office, interviewing candidates, and officially extending a call. A huge thanks also goes out to all the people that I work with to help make worship and the church run; Kris, Lois, Esther, Jean, and the many others who help out behind the scenes.

As we move into 2016, I look forward to continuing the visioning with you all as we begin to look at where we can extend our ministry opportunities both within the congregation and the greater community.

#### Some things change

#### Pastoral Leadership

This has been the most drastic change of the year for our congregation. Pastor Jeni accepted the call to be a Country Coordinator for Young Adults in Global Mission for the ELCA in Jerusalem and the West Bank; her last day at Glyndon Lutheran was January 8<sup>th</sup>. Pastor Steve Wold, my uncle, was our Interim Pastor. It was a joy to be able to work with him during the transition. Then on June 28<sup>th</sup>, at a congregational meeting, Pastor Kayla Billings was voted on to become our new pastor. Pastor Kayla started on July 22<sup>nd</sup>, and has been a wonderful colleague to work with, and I am looking forward to all the ministry that we will get to do together in the future.

#### Faith Formation

This year, the school district needed to change how they do their lunch/Rebel hour at the High School; thus, we can no longer have "Thursday lunches" as Faith Formation for our 9<sup>th</sup> graders. Pastor Kayla and I have switched the meeting to monthly "mini-retreats" for four hours, one Sunday a month, October – January. We continue to use the Apostle's Creed as the center of our time together. We will also have a retreat day in the spring to help them shape their Faith Statements for their Affirmation of Baptism; the service which will remain on Reformation Sunday of their 10<sup>th</sup> grade year.

#### **DGF**

I love being a Rebel. I got to attend many events; Glyndon Days festivities, Middle School and High School games/meets, band and choir concerts, and High School graduation (and Open Houses). This past year, I got to be part of two special events. I got to chaperone the DGF High School band and choir trip to Orlando and chaperone the High School Prom. It was an honor to be able to participate in both events, spending time with our young people and their friends during those two important moments that hold special memories for their time in High School.

#### Some things remain the same

#### Faith Formation

Though some has changed in the area of Faith Formation most of our programming has remained the same. For a second year we have partnered with Dilworth Lutheran for Day Camp for our Elementary aged young people. It is a joy to work with Dilworth Lutheran and the Pathways Summer Staff to make learning about God/faith an exciting thing. This past year the theme was "Endless Love".

I meet with the three year olds - 4<sup>th</sup> graders meet on Sunday mornings after worship and Wednesday (shortened) educational time before worship.

The 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders meet after school on Wednesdays diving into the Biblical narrative. I also led the 5<sup>th</sup> graders in their 5 week First Communion preparation.

The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders meet after worship on Wednesdays; I work with the Pastor and prepare the lesson plans in the winter and spring. This past year the focus was on the 10 Commandments. And this past fall I worked with Pastor Kayla on teaching about the Reformation and Advent, this spring we will focus on prayer and the Lord's Prayer.

This fall I met with the 10<sup>th</sup> graders to help them write their Faith Stories in preparation for their Affirmation of Faith Service, which was October 25<sup>th</sup>.

#### Family Minister's Report Continued...

#### Service Opportunities

I continue to plan and execute the Servant Events for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders. Including two Twin Cities trips; one in the fall to pack meals at Feed My Starving Children and go to ValleyScare, and the 36 Hour Adventure in the summer which includes fun activities and service opportunities.

In January, myself and four other congregation members went to Pignon, Haiti to work with College De La Grace. This was the third time in five years that members of Glyndon Lutheran have served at the school. We are planning on offering this opportunity every other year (odd numbered years).

#### Synod

In 2015, the partnership that Glyndon Lutheran has with the Synod remained at 1/4 time. My Synod position continued to be primarily planning and executing the Synod's Youth Gatherings. 2015's Synod Gatherings were the best to date. I was in charge of the youth delegates at the Synod Assembly in May. I continue to be the NWMN Synod's Practice Discipleship Coach; I led workshops and trainings around the Synod on the state of the Church and how to be affective given the ever changing demographic of the Church. I was the NWMN Synod's National Gathering Coordinator for the Gathering that was in Detroit, MI in July of 2015; with that I organized and led the bus trip for Pathways Bible Camps. I took to two youth delegates from the LYO Board of the Synod to Camp Carol Joy Holling in November for the ELCA Youth Leadership Summit. I am also active in the SYMBOL (Synodical Youth Ministry Band Of Leaders) Network being the Chair of the Region 3 Steering Committee, helping to organize the Annual Gathering in February and the Continuing Education event in November.

## But one thing will never change

As the verse states at the beginning, Jesus Christ is the same, unchanging, and is the only constant in our lives. Looking ahead to 2016 is exciting, as long as our focus remains on Jesus, our ministries may change direction, or not. It says earlier in the book of Hebrews that we should "fix our eyes upon Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith." As a fellow minister of Glyndon Lutheran, I will try to do this, and I ask the same of you.

Darlene Sandal and Pat Hemmah are the representatives for Glyndon Lutheran Church to the New Life Center auxiliary (NLC). We meet at area churches once a month for a noon luncheon, business meeting, and program. A major fundraiser for the auxiliary is the Prayer Breakfast held each spring. Several hundred women attend this event.

This year, the New Life Center was also blessed to receive donations from the local production of *It's a Wonderful Life* held this past December. Although totals are not known at this time, we understand that the New Life Center would receive over \$50,000 from this production.

The auxiliary provides the following items for the men at the NLC during the year: sheets, pillows, blankets, towels, coffee, canned goods, clothing items, pumpkin pies for their Thanksgiving dinner, Christmas cookies, and more. As you can see, there is a dire need for the auxiliary.

Glyndon Lutheran Church was asked to donate items of clothing (socks, underwear, gloves, and stocking hats) during December to be given as Christmas presents for the residents. We offer thanks to all who helped us make this year a success while continuing to support the NLC!

As 2016 begins, there is lots of excitement at the NLC as a new building was acquired permitting the store to be moved and more shelter space to be created. We look forward to sharing with you how NLC continues to make a difference in the F-M area community.
